# Can You KENKEN?

## Improve your bridge with KenKen®!

KenKen® is a new twist on the number puzzles that have come from Japan to our newspapers and puzzle magazines. It was invented in 2004 by **Tetsuya Miyamoto**, an innovative instructor who promotes a method of “teaching without teaching.” Mr. Miyamoto’s weekend classroom has many hopeful applicants each year, and his students dominate Japan’s Math Olympics. KenKen® (which means “cleverness squared”) is one of many tools he uses to get students thinking instead of memorizing.

With Mr. Miyamoto’s method in mind, it seems appropriate to simply present the rules of KenKen® to get you started:

**The object:** fill in numbers in the grid from 1 to the grid size. A grid of four-by-four like the one below contains only the numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4 when solved. Grid sizes can range from 3x3 (easy) to 9x9 (challenging)!

Do not repeat a number in any row or column.

The numbers in each heavily outlined set of squares, called **cages**, must combine (in any order) to produce the target number in the top corner of the cage, using the mathematical operation indicated.

Cages with just one box should be filled in with the target number in the top corner.

A number can be repeated within a cage, as long as it is not repeated in the same row or column.

Good luck! (A more challenging puzzle is on the inside back cover.)
