ing when they finish a club game. I have lists from some local clubs, but not all of them, so I haven't made a complete Unit list. I'll post the ones I have today near the entry selling locations.

Evening hospitality has been a feature of the Vancouver Regional, and players have enjoyed a nice snack after their evening session game during the first five nights. Opening night fare was a selection of different pies, followed by chili and cornbread Tuesday, beef skewers Wednesday, corn chowder Thursday and fruit kebabs Friday. Ice cream is Saturday's special — but you need to play the evening session. Service starts at 10pm, outside the Guildford Ballroom. Players finishing their games in the Fraser or Barnston Rooms are welcome!

We ask again that players not take more than a single helping for themselves: there is only enough for everyone if all cooperate. Hospitality is not intended to cause frustration for those who arrive only in time to watch others eat multiple helpings. Inconsiderate behavior may result in no hospitality next time. Please do what's right.

Tournament Chair **Cam Doner** has arranged a formidable array of speakers this week. All of these informal sessions are free and begin at 6:15pm in the Guildford Ballroom:

Yesterday: **Wayne Burrows**, Palmerston North, New Zealand (not '4412' as ACBLScore thinks...)

Saturday: **Marc Jacobus**, Las Vegas NV (cross your fingers, says Cam, who is still trying to make this happen).

Smoking is not allowed anywhere inside the building. Because of the windy and cold conditions outside, we ask that players go outside (and re-enter) through the main hotel entrance and **not** through the doors adjacent to the Guildford Ballroom, so that we can control the temperature of the main playing area. The smoking area outside the main lobby entrance is covered, going out the Guildford Ballroom doors can get you very wet and can send in a gust of wind that tosses all the flyers to the floor. It may seem like only a few seconds exposure to one person, but when one does it, others follow, and the foyer temperature plummets with the doors wide open for an extended period of time. The automatic temperature control then heats the foyer...and broils the playing area!

Sunday's Swiss Teams plan has changed somewhat since the flyer was printed. Team entries will be \$136 for two sessions and they will get you a soup and wrap during a short break for everyone on your team.

Bulletins are posted online early each morning, with hand records and complete results from each pair game (results from each board, with names, posted beside the hand itself). This is a new feature, posted last night by 11:30, after some difficulties earlier in the week. It's all here:

The break between the end of the afternoon session and the reception caused attendance to be a bit lower than expected, but the resulting surplus of food was another bonus!

Check out the PDI display outside the Guildford Ballroom. **Larry Chow** and **Lynda Cole** will do their best to find you a suitable book to improve your game, the newest additions to the bridge best sellers lists, some bridge software to accelerate your expertise, or that special piece of bridge equipment that you've been hoping to find. Peruse their display before and after the evening session and before the afternoon session.

Notes & Notables

Saturday edition

The early morning winds blew the clouds away, but not before pelting me with hail Friday morning as I went to get the Daily Bulletins. The generic Vancouver winter forecast—prepare for rain at any time—continues through the weekend. Good thing bridge is an indoor game.

Underground parking here means you need not get wet at all as you arrive. Parking passes are available (only \$5.00/day) at the Partnership/Hospitality Desk. If there is nobody there, you will be able to get your pass at the hotel's main desk.

Directions. Walk in the front door, stop, and shake off the rain. Straight ahead is the hotel lounge and restaurant. A left just before you get to the lounge will take you to the elevators. An immediate sharp left will take you to the Hospitality and Partnership Desk, the PDI book sellers location, and the Guildford Ballroom, the main playing area. Going in the other direction, off to the right, around the lounge and restaurant, takes you past the hotel main desk, and around into a second playing area consisting of the Barnston Room, behind the restaurant, and the Fraser Room, further back.

All morning events are played in the Fraser Room. Afternoon and evening pairs events will be held in the Guildford ballroom, with continuing and compact knockouts and in the Fraser and Barnston rooms. Entries are sold just outside the room in which they are held.

The snack bar outside the Fraser and Barnston rooms (the playing area behind the restaurant) is open from about 8:30am to 1pm, and again from about 4:30 to 9pm. They have a nice selection of sandwiches, soups, snacks and beverages in the morning, but sell mostly coffee and beverages in the evening.

The most common question this week: have I qualified for the NAP District Final? You need to break average in a club qualifying game during the June-July-August qualifying period, or finish in the top half or your strat. But it seems that most people don't bother check-

Scents and "Scents"-itivity

Please be considerate of players with severe allergies and limit your use of strong scents. A hint is better than a tour of the inside of the bottle.

Beautiful boards!

Please help us make them last!

All of us could do a better job in ensuring that our beautiful metal boards last. Commonly-seen infractions involving duplicate boards include the following:

Turning played boards over on the stack. The felt bottom on metal boards is there so that when they are stacked normally, the felt polishes the top of the board below. Turned over, you have felt polishing felt, and metal scratching against metal. The stickers on the top of the board come loose when they rub up against metal. And while they lie on the table upside-down, a card may be exposed to someone walking by: you can tell an honor from a spot card from the thumb niche in the bottom.

Many players don't like to have too many boards in the table stack. Fine, but please don't take the boards to be played later and drop them on the floor from a height of several feet! Or toss them to the next table without getting up! You'd never do this with a stack of CDs; why it is OK for a stack of boards? Unnecessary dents and paint chips reduces their lifespan. Get a chair and put boards on it. Or bend a little.

The stickers on boards, and especially the cards in them, often need to be replaced after thoughtless players finish a quickie meal from KFC and begin play without so much as a wipe. **Lynda Cole** will tell you about the tournament where they offered corn on the cob in the middle of a session...

A little common sense from everyone will make our bridge equipment go a long way. Please be considerate.
